RE: Compassionate Release

Dear Honorable Judge Shea:

I am contacting you in the hopes of you granting me compassionate release so that I may seek outside medical assistance for my right foot and right upper ankle injury amputation. As you are aware from the PSI, on May 5, 2016 I was struck on my Harley and suffered damage and injury to my right foot (pre and post surgical images). The foot separated into two pieces. The hardware used to repair the injury has shifted and interfering with proper wound healing and severe pain with deformity and a pronounced limp upon ambulation.

I have had several wound debridments while in prison, as well as 8 wound infections, one of which required hospitalization with intravenous antibiotics while I was incarcerated in the BOP.

If granted compassionate release, I would be able to utilize outside medical specialists for proper treatment and wound care/treatment and facilities that simply is not available to me in the prison system. The living conditions in prison are incompatible with proper healing, as the wound remains open and some/all of the hardware needs to be removed to promote proper healing and avoid

disfigurement.

My wound is oozing clear or bloody discharge on a daily basis, and this open wound in a prison environment makes it very possible for me to develop a severe wound infection, possibly leading to sepsis and possibly death if not properly and timely treated.

I have complete family support if released. I will live with my parents in Arizona, and I already have the doctors that have originally worked on me available. I also have work lined up to support myself and the medical needs I will require.

I have completed several programs while incarcerated, and I remain incident free, without disciplinary actions or write ups. I intend to continue my rehabilitation if granted compassionate release as well.

Thank you for taking the time to review this letter. I will not let anyone down if I am granted this chance.
